


REAL COMMUNITY OVERSIGHT OF THE NEWARK POLICE: WHAT THE NEWARK CCRB WILL DO

For 50 years the people of Newark fought for civilian oversight of policing. **Now, that day has arrived.**

On March 16, 2016, Mayor Ras Baraka and the Newark Municipal Council created one of the nation's strongest **civilian complaint review boards (CCRB)**. Newark is now working to build it.

-  **11 members:**
-  7 nominated by community and civil rights organizations
-  3 by the Municipal Council
-  Newark's Inspector General



CIVILIAN COMPLAINT REVIEW BOARD




DISCIPLINE THAT STICKS

Power to make sure officers are disciplined. The Police Department must discipline a police officer if the CCRB finds that misconduct took place, unless there's a clear error in the investigation.



A CHECK ON POLICIES

Power to review police policies and practices that can lead to misconduct by officers.




POWERFUL INVESTIGATIONS

- Independent, professional, full-time investigators.
- Subpoena power to investigate complaints of police misconduct.



TRANSPARENT POLICING

Responsibility to regularly report to the people of Newark basic information on policing, including on stop-and-frisk, use of force, arrests and summonses.
